Stan Mannschreck Re-elected to NIAA's Board of Directors

COLORADO SPRINGS, COLO.— Stan Mannschreck, Anadarko, Okla., was re-elected by members of the National Institute for Animal Agriculture to serve on the organization's 21-member Board of Directors. Mannschreck is president and CEO of Mannschreck Cattle Co., a family farming and ranching corporation that maintains a cow/calf, stocker cattle and wheat operation in Caddo and Comanche counties in southwest Oklahoma. He also manages multiple oil and gas mineral interests for his family and others.

In addition, he is the Finance Committee Chairman of the First United Methodist Church, Anadarko, Okla.
