Nebraska first began registering premises in September 2004.

We utilized a registration system approved by USDA, but developed in Nebraska.





Nebraska began registering premises in 2004 under existing Nebraska law that granted the department broad authority to take action to control and eradicate livestock disease.





Legislation was introduced in the 2005 Unicameral to grant the Department express authority to develop state components of the National Animal Identification System (NAIS).





Industry groups supported the legislation, including:

- Nebraska Cattlemen
- Nebraska Farm Bureau
- Nebraska Pork Producers Association
- Nebraska Farmers Union





The legislation was signed into law in 2006 and became effective last month.





Components of the Nebraska law:

- Provides express authority for NDA to implement a premises registration program and other state elements of NAIS.
- Provides express authority for NDA to cooperate and coordinate with USDA and other public and private entities on NAIS.
- Establishes restrictions on the handling of information collected in conjunction with NAIS.





The law does NOT set forth details and specific actions to be taken by NDA. It leaves room for us to adapt to programmatic changes that may be initiated at the federal level.





Current registration numbers under
Nebraska's voluntary system:

13,000 premises for roughly 40
percent of total estimated premises





National Animal Identification System

A state-federal-industry partnership to standardize and expand animal identification programs and practices to all livestock.





National Animal Identification System

Provide animal health officials with the capability to identify all livestock and premises that have had direct contact with a disease of concern within 48 hours of discovery.





National Animal Identification System

NAIS is being developed in three stages:

- Premises identification
- Animal identification
- Animal tracking

Any location where animals are managed or held. This includes all locations where livestock is born, raised, marketed, or exhibited.

Information Needed to Register

- Your premises' section, township, and range
- GPS coordinates for your location
 - Not required but highly encouraged
 - Available from your local Farm Service Agency office

Register Your Premises

Premises Identification Number (PIN)

- 7-digit code
- Unique to a physical location
- Utilized for traceback in the event of an animal disease outbreak
